

## VICAR'S LETTER

Dear friends,

A very Happy Easter to you all.

As I write there is a lot more positive news around with many of us having received vaccines and the nation beginning to open up again. Spring is properly upon us, the weather is better and life always, at least for me, feels so hopeful once the gloom of winter is over and the anticipation of summer is on the distant horizon.

Spring is a time of new growth and new creation. As I look at the garden and the fields, and look up towards the mountains (which I'm privileged to do where I live) you just get a breathtaking sense of the power of God in creation. I find it hard to imagine that all the beauty around us could possibly just be an accident. I'm reminded of the joke that used to do the rounds "*On the sixth day God created the platypus. And God said: 'Let's see the evolutionists try and figure this one out!'*"

Spring, which I began with, is often the time when our attitude towards life becomes more positive, or has the potential to be more positive. Someone once said "*Attitude is the mind's paintbrush. It can colour any situation*".
