## VICAR'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

As you read this you will probably be making preparations for Christmas; and I would like to take this opportunity to wish you all a very Happy Christmas and a blessed New Year.

The joy of Christmas is of course centred on the birth of a little baby.

Over the last few months we have had the immense privilege of seeing both our children, within a few weeks of each other, becoming parents of their own little babies. Our new grandchildren, Isaac and Caleb, are an absolute joy. The names their parents chose for them have biblical meaning.

Isaac means 'laughter' in Hebrew. In the Bible Isaac was the son of Abraham and Sarah. Abraham was 100 years old when Isaac was born and Sarah, with a sense of awe and disbelief at becoming such elderly parents, said, "*God has made laughter for me*" Genesis 21: 6

Caleb means 'boldness' in Hebrew. It could also mean one who is 'intrepid'. In the Bible Caleb was a leader alongside Joshua as the Israelites entered the promised land (Numbers 14: 24).

Whether we have a Biblical name or not, and I'm uncertain "Lee" can be found overtly in the scriptures, our names do have meaning; not least because the name we are baptised in to is the name that God and all heaven knows us by.

The name Jesus, the one who we celebrate at Christmas (and all year in fact), means "God saves". Unlike the rest of us Jesus was given His name, not by His earthly parents, but by God the Father and delivered to Mary and Joseph by angels. In Philippians 2:9-11 it says this about the name of Jesus: "*Therefore God has highly exalted Him and has freely bestowed on Him the name that is above every name, that at the mention of the name of Jesus every knee shall bow, of those in heaven, those on earth and those under the earth and that every tongue shall confess that Jesus Christ is Lord to the Glory of God the Father.*"

Jesus, just as His name implies, is literally the one who has the power to save us. God exalted Jesus Christ by giving power to the name of Jesus Christ. The outworking of this is that we know a name that is above all other names given on earth. There is no situation that is above the name of Jesus.

Whatever we face, our first option should always be to call upon the name of Jesus Christ, for through His name the foundations are shaken, demons tremble and difficulties are overcome. So if you ever feel down, sad, in need of direction or lost, call upon the name of Jesus and He shall set you free. For He is the way, the truth and the life.
